

Electrical and electronic equipment – Information from manufacturers for business users B2B

The UK WEEE Regulations contains many requirements for disposal of WEEE. The most important ones are compiled here.

1. Separate disposal of WEEE

Electrical and electronic equipment that has become waste is referred to as WEEE. Owners of WEEE must dispose of it separately from unsorted municipal waste. WEEE does not belong in household waste, but in special collection and return systems.

2. Batteries, accumulators and lamps

Owners of WEEE shall separate spent batteries and accumulators that are not enclosed in the WEEE, as well as lamps that can be removed from the WEEE without damaging it, from the WEEE before handing it over to a collection point. This does not apply if WEEE is prepared for reuse with the participation of a public waste management authority.

3. Possibilities of returning WEEE

In order to create opportunities for the return of WEEE, we work with several qualified recycling companies. If a device manufactured by us becomes an old device and you would like to return it, please contact us and fill in the questionnaire next page.

4. Privacy Policy

WEEE often contain sensitive personal data. This applies to information and telecommunications technology devices such as computers and smartphones. In your own interest, please note that each end user is responsible for deleting the data on the old devices to be disposed of.

5. Crossed out wheeled-bin symbol



To remind owners that old electrical equipment can be recycled, it is now marked with a crossed-out wheeled bin symbol. The WEEE must be collected separately from unsorted municipal waste at the end of its service life.

Questionnaire

The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Regulations aim to reduce the amount of WEEE ending up in landfill and require the collection, treatment and recycling or reuse of waste electricals to meet UK and European targets.

6. Any access restrictions for collection vehicles (height, width etc.)

7. The postcode of where the items are located

8. Do you wish for the items to be destroyed or to go for reuse or recycling

9. Finally – not essential, but it would be useful to have a photograph of each of the types of products.
